CHALLENGES AND CARES ACT UPDATE

In April, we discussed the dual challenges --

- Loss of Measure I
 - \$12 million in debt service savings no longer available
 - \$9 million in structural imbalance identified in Strategic Plan must be addressed
- Continued concern about the ongoing COVID-19 shelter-in-place order
 - Loss of Fare revenue \$90,000 weekly
 - Staff vacancies, new leave mandates (unfunded)
 - Significant immediate and ongoing sales tax revenue impacts
- We identified early in this process an \$11 million potential loss in the current Fiscal Year 2019-20 that ends on June 30. This was based on:
 - Loss of 20% sales tax related revenue in Fiscal Year 2019-20 which ends in June.
 Loss of 30% in budgeted fare revenue for Fiscal Year 2019-20.
 As more time passes and more data becomes available, this impact could change in either direction.

CHALLENGES AND CARES ACT UPDATE

Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security (CARES) Act

- April 22 MTC Meeting: SMART's allocation approved for \$10.3 million
- Sufficient to cover most of expected loss of \$11 million in current Fiscal Year 2019-20 budget
- Only 61% of the funds were allocated
- Additional 39%, if allocated = \$6.6 million to cover Fiscal Year 2020-21 deficit from COVID-19
- If MTC changes the formula SMART could receive more or less
 - For example: If amount reduced by 50% to \$3 million, that would equate to more difficult budget cuts potentially, equivalent to 17 fulltime employees



REVENUE PROJECTIONS

CARES Act Funding is crucial to weathering this financial crises.

- The funding will be used to fill the following budget/revenue holes:
 - Anticipated losses of \$11 million in Fiscal Year 2019-20
 - Possible continued loss of \$11-14 million in Fiscal Year 2020-21
- Without CARES Act Relief, SMART would be required to make faster, deeper cuts in service and staffing



REVENUE PROJECTIONS: CHALLENGE FOR NEXT BUDGET

First Challenge: Measure I failure eliminating significant debt service relief

Second Challenge: Predicting and absorbing sales tax losses until the economy recovers

- Meeting these challenges requires a starting point and choosing what level of revenue to budget in the coming years
- Yet, there is NO ROADMAP for the current crises
- Will there be quick rebound? Multiyear Recession? Economists disagree



REVENUE PROJECTIONS: FISCAL YEAR 2020-21

Using the assumptions already outlined for closing the current Fiscal Year 2019-20, we have considered three different Impact Scenarios for the Proposed Fiscal Year 2020-21 Budget Process:

Deep Impact: Sales tax continues to drop and levels out to lose almost 25% over current year budget.

Moderate Impact: Sales tax begins to climb back slightly and ends the year losing slightly more than 15% of Fiscal Year 2019-20 budget.

Mild Impact: Taxes improve and rebound resulting in a 8% drop from our budgeted amount in Fiscal Year 2019-20.

- All three scenarios assume same starting point, but end very differently
- Each scenario assumes full allocation of CARES Act funds from FTA
- Even in the best scenario, sales tax in FY 2021 is \$3 million lower than what was budgeted for this Fiscal Year 2019-20



Three major strategies for budget reduction proposals for Fiscal Year 2020-21.

- 1. One-time savings
- 2. Reduction in Ongoing Expense Non-salary
- 3. Reduction in Expense Due to Reductions in Service



Moving toward savings opportunities, starting with a hiring freeze, which has resulted in 16 positions currently vacant. In addition we have identified more details under our three reduction strategies.

1. One-time savings: Total of \$3.5 Million

One-time Revenues: Budget will not include/make use of one-time revenue anticipated for Railroad Square or Petaluma properties

The sooner we can get started on these, items the more we will save. Requesting three immediate non-salary reduction actions.



Requesting Authority for Immediate Action Items:

1. Early Notice to WiFi Contractors:

- Free WiFi at the stations are a provided at no cost to SMART as part of our public-private partnership with local firm Sonic.
- Onboard WiFi requires \$531,872 annually.
- Reduced bandwidth/service would only reduce our cost by \$50,000.
- Notice to the contractor now so that we can recoup savings as quickly as possible.

2. Authority for contract extension with PFM to pursue refinancing

Potential for \$1 million in annual savings on debt on our construction bonds.

- Requires immediate preparation of RFP and analysis in conjunction with financial advisors, PFM,
- Using current negotiated rates, execute extension of up to additional \$150,000 to assist with process



3. Rail liability Insurance: Cost avoidance strategy

- Specialized -- unlike normal liability
- Requires multiple layers with up to 15 different large insurers

In 2016, liability cap was raised by Federal government from \$200 to \$295 million, SMART increased its coverage that year to match.

Annual cost currently: \$1.3 million.

- Market has been very volatile during this crises
- Facing increases of up to 50% in certain insurance layers.

With no change --\$635,000 increase in our annual premiums for rail liability.

This an increase that we cannot absorb even in a normal year.

- We can only purchase coverage that we can sustain and that reasonably protects SMART from incidents that may occur.
- Requesting authority to return in our rail liability coverage to the \$200 million level
- Keeps our cost increases to approximately 5% of the current amount, or \$133,000.

Must move forward immediately to secure even the \$200 million amount.

3: Reduction in Ongoing Service and Staff: \$5.8 Million

- a. Elimination of Weekend Service:
 - Cost reductions of \$2.2 million
 - Revenue loss of \$600,000, net savings of \$1.6 million
 - Potential reduction of 14 FTE
- b. Reconfiguration of Train Service to 22 Trips Daily
 - 5 morning and afternoon commute trains, 1 midday
 - Total of 22 daily
 - \$4.7 million in savings, revenue loss of \$1.5 million
 - Potential loss of 31 FTE
- c. Other reductions to benefits and pay
 - eliminating cost of living increases
 - capping SMART's share of medical plans
 - voluntary separation incentives

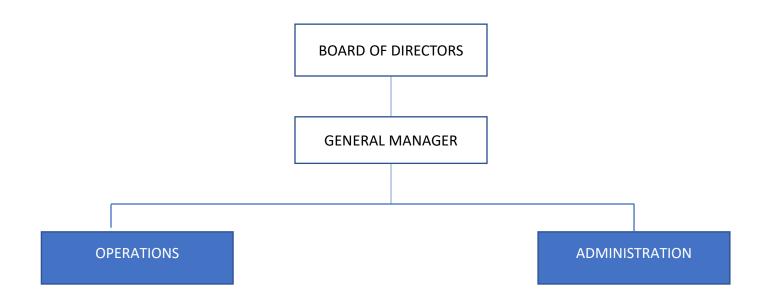

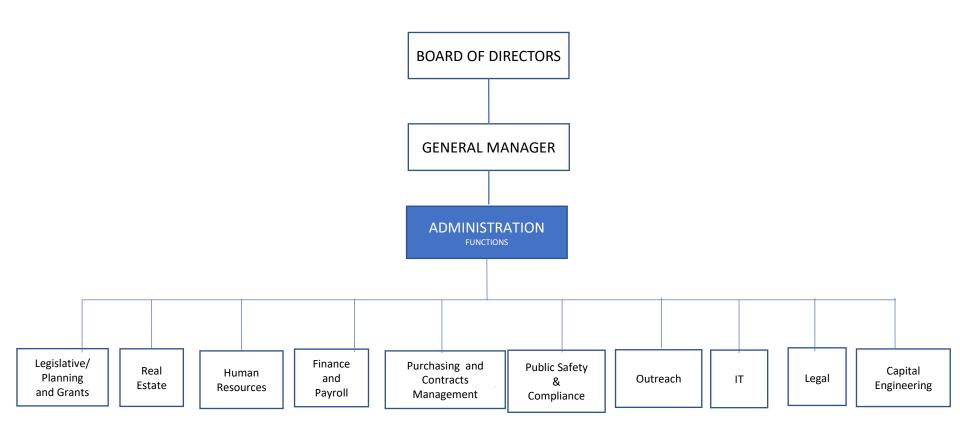


WHAT IT TAKES TO OPERATE A COMMUTER TRAIN





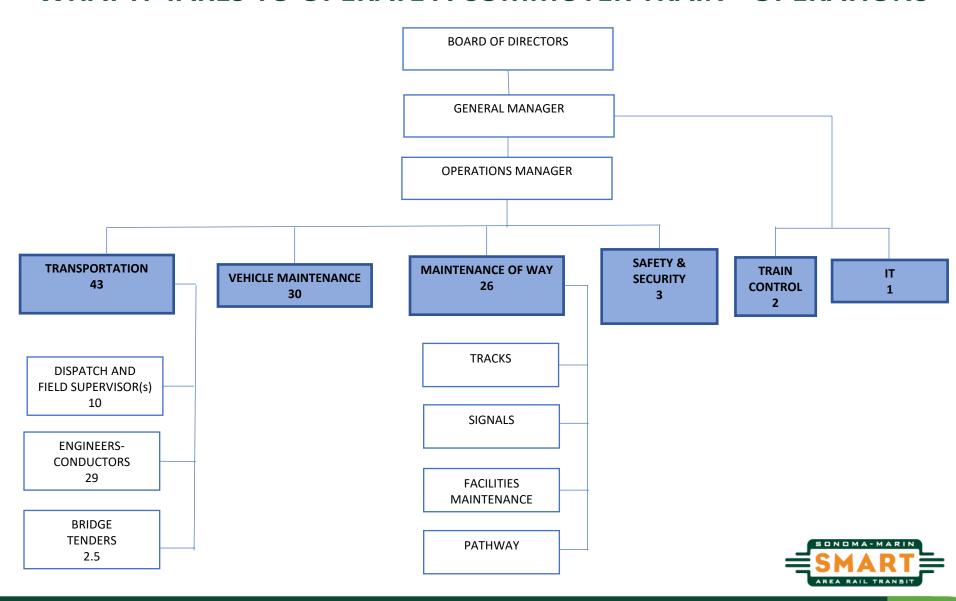
WHAT IT TAKES TO OPERATE A COMMUTER TRAIN – ADMINISTRATION

- Track

TRACKS

- SMART currently owns 57.3 miles plus 25miles (Brazos) plus 21 more miles if SB-1029 is approved.
- Total tracks in operation: 57 miles plus 21 miles in Brazos
- Federal Railroad Administration requires every inch of track inspected twice per week for passenger service tracks and once a week on freight routes
- 74 miles of vegetation control
- 9 Full Time Employees responsible for maintenance, inspection and response to issues



SIGNAL SYSTEMS

- 72 at-grade crossings for passenger & Freight service
- 7 at-grade crossings for Freight (Brazos)
- 64 wayside signals
- 38 switches
- Positive Train Control System
- Federal Railroad Administration requires monthly, quarterly and annual inspections
- 11 Full Time Employees responsible for maintenance, inspection and response to issues



FACILITIES

- 2 tunnels
- 32 bridges plus 30 bridges (Brazos) plus 5 (Windsor) plus 3 moveable bridges (two in Brazos)
- 12 stations plus Windsor
- 12 miles of bike/pedestrian pathways
- 5 Park and Ride Lots plus Windsor
- 25 miles of fencing
- 4 Maintenance Facilities
- 4 Full Time Employees responsible for maintenance, inspection and response to issues



VEHICLE MAINTENANCE

- 18 Train Cars: Diesel Multiple Units
- 32 Maintenance and Agency vehicles.
- Total 28 Full Time Employees
 - 10 Laborers: clean inside the train, fueling, cleaning bathrooms and waste disposal
 - 16 vehicle technicians and supervisors covering 3 shifts
 - 2 parts and inventory control
- Provide full maintenance activities and inspections including: daily inspections, cleaning, repairs and Wheel Truing as well as FRA required weekly, monthly, quarterly and annual maintenance.
- Repairs mechanical systems, including diesel engines, air brakes and running gear.

What Does It Take To Run Only One Train?

- There are multiple fixed costs associated with running a commuter rail operations
- Even if you only run one train:
 - Need to maintain 45 miles of tracks
 - Need to maintain all grade-crossings
 - Need to maintain all signal systems
 - Need to maintain all stations
 - Need to maintain Positive Train Control
 - Need to staff and manage a 24-7, 365 days a year dispatch center
- These fixed costs support the variable cost of actual train service
- Reductions fall disproportionally on train service itself



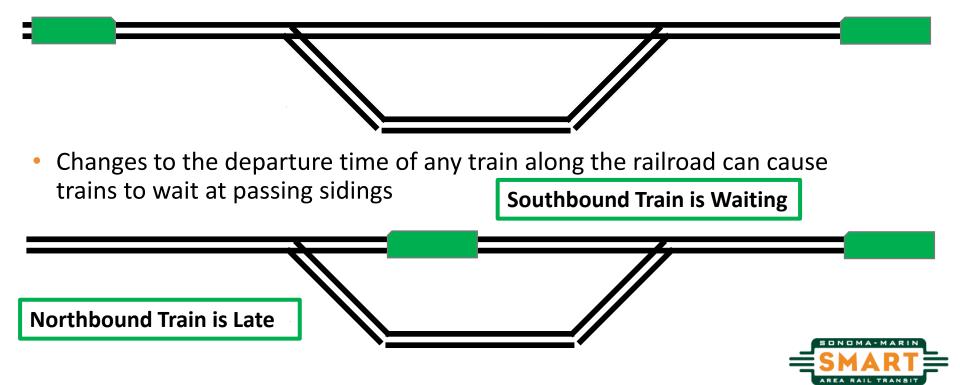
Staff Needed To Run Only One Train

- 4 Engineer/Conductors
- 4 Dispatch and Field Supervisors
- 19 Tracks, Signals, Facility and Pathway
- 5 Vehicle Maintenance
- 3 Safety and Security
- 1 Train Control
- 1 Code Compliance
- 1 Administrative Support
- 1 Manager
- Plus Payroll, Finance, Legal, Human Resources, IT, Purchasing, Real Estate, Capital etc.



SMART – Operating Schedule Overview

- During commute periods, a train makes a departure every 32 minutes
- This 32 minute "headway" allows for SMART's trains to predictably and reliably "meet" and pass each other at sidings located along the railroad, which is predominately single track



SMART – Operating Schedule Overview

- The following slide shows the movement of trains overlaid on SMART's schedule
- Each color represents an individual train crew making a trip on the 32 minute headway
- Due to the impact to other trains on the system, trains cannot be added between these trips

SUMMARY

We have identified a range of budget options and savings proposals. Those include:

- One-time savings: Total of \$3.5 million
- Reduction in Ongoing Expense, Non-Service: Total of \$2.6 million annually
- Reduction in Ongoing Expense Due to Reductions in Service/Staff: Net savings of \$5.8 million annually



RECOMMENDATIONS

Today, in advance of your consideration of the revised Fiscal Year 2019-20 and Proposed 2020-21 budget, we recommend your Board:

- 1. Provide Input on Budget and Operational Changes
- Approve Early Actions on Fiscal Year 2019-20 and 2020-21 Budget items for:
 - a. Elimination of On Board WiFi Service
 - b. Reduce rail liability insurance
 - c. Proceed with steps for Bond Refinancing
 - d. Direct staff to notify public on service reductions
